Participants will drive independently to Ravinia, an internationally renowned music festival site (a 10-minute drive from the Renaissance Hotel and just 5 minutes from the Chicago Botanic Garden).

Join us for a tour of Ravinia's sculpture collection, which began in 1976 with *Music for A While*, a monumental Corten steel sculpture gifted by Ravinia Life Trustee Richard Hunt, one of the foremost artists of the 20th century. Since then, other generous donors have contributed to this impressive collection, which ranges from massive to miniature works.

We will spend the hour leisurely walking along the Bernbaum Sculpture Walk, featuring 36 pieces from Ravinia's collection. The tour will be led by Charlotte Hadley, a longtime CSDS member and member of the Ravinia Women's Board.

Explore the Chicago Botanic Garden's Kris Jarantoski Campus, home to the CBG's Production Greenhouses. Spanning 55,000 square feet of energy-efficient indoor growing space and 151,000 square feet of outdoor nursery space, these state-of-the-art facilities enable the Garden to maintain horticulture excellence and support advanced plant conservation research. The Greenhouses produce plants for many seasonal indoor and outdoor displays as well as house permanent plant collections such as the famed bonsai plants, an orchidarium, and the *Amorphophallus titanum* plants also known as Titan Arum or corpse plants. Step behind the scenes on an exclusive tour, meet the expert horticulturists, and uncover the secrets of plant production at the Chicago Botanic Garden.

The tour will also include a visit to the rare book collection at CBG's Lenhardt Library. In 2002, the CBG acquired an incredible collection of 2500 rare books and 2000 historic periodical titles that span five centuries of research in botany, botanical art, horticulture, agriculture, gardening and landscape design. The digitized rare books included in Illinois Digital Archives provide an opportunity for close examination of unique materials.
